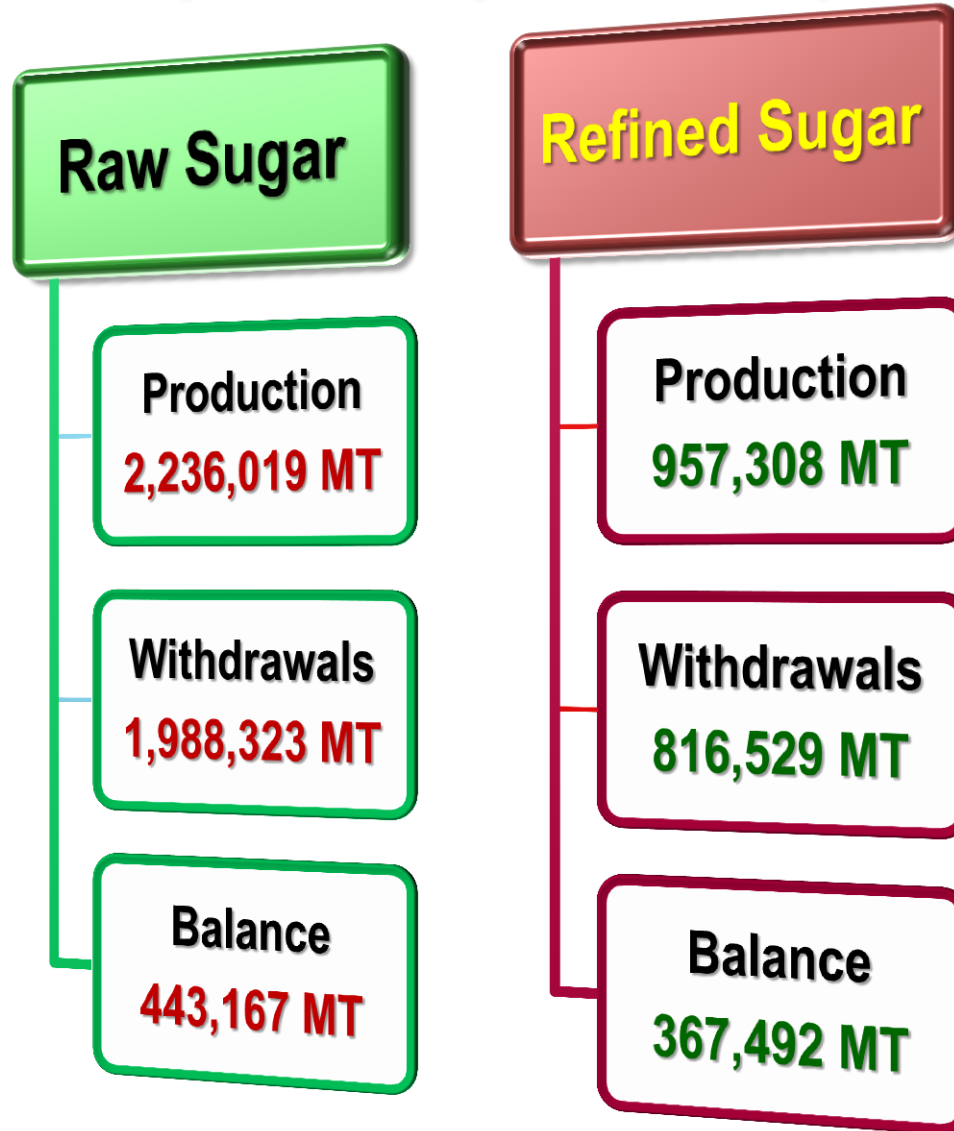

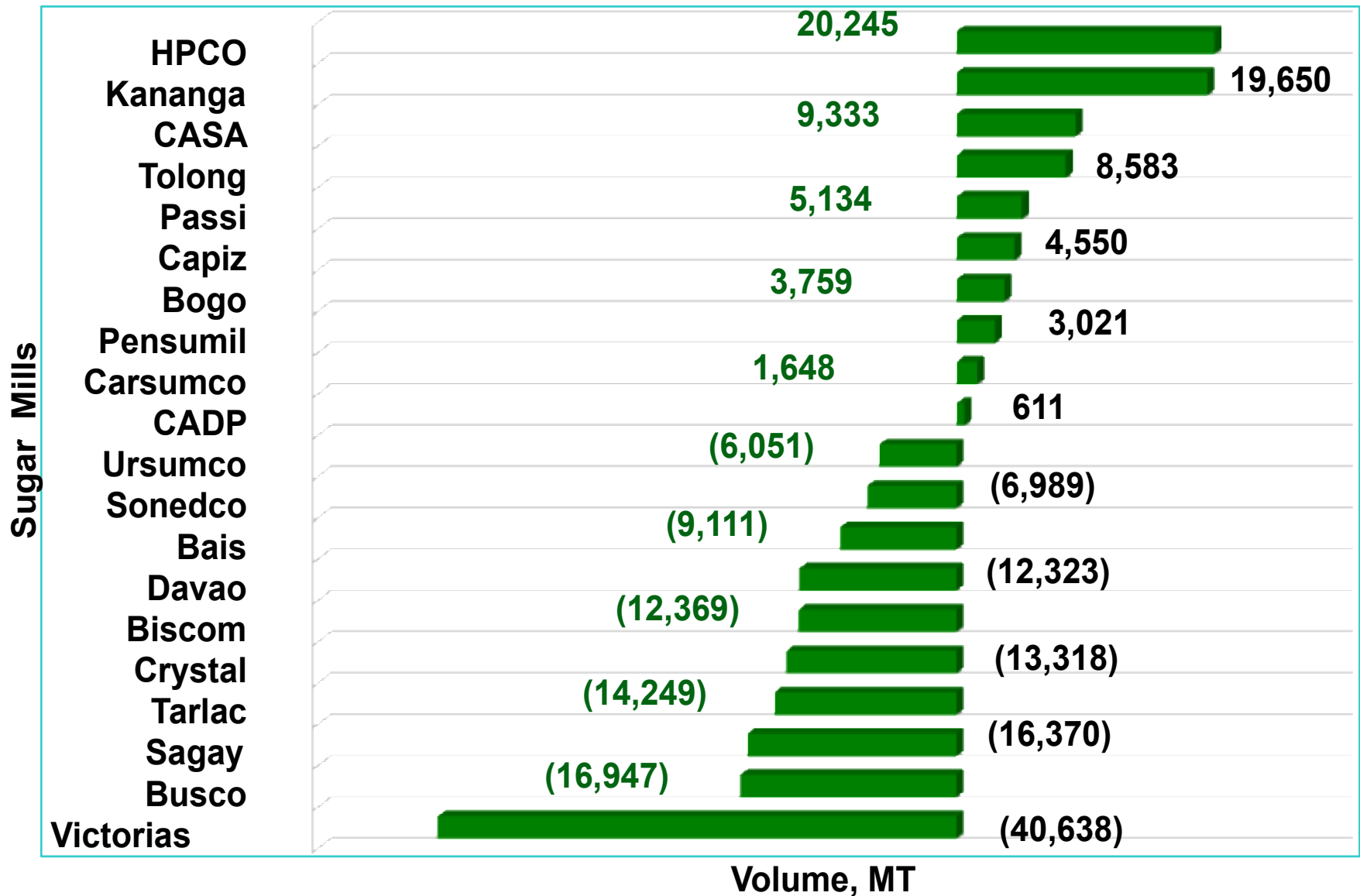

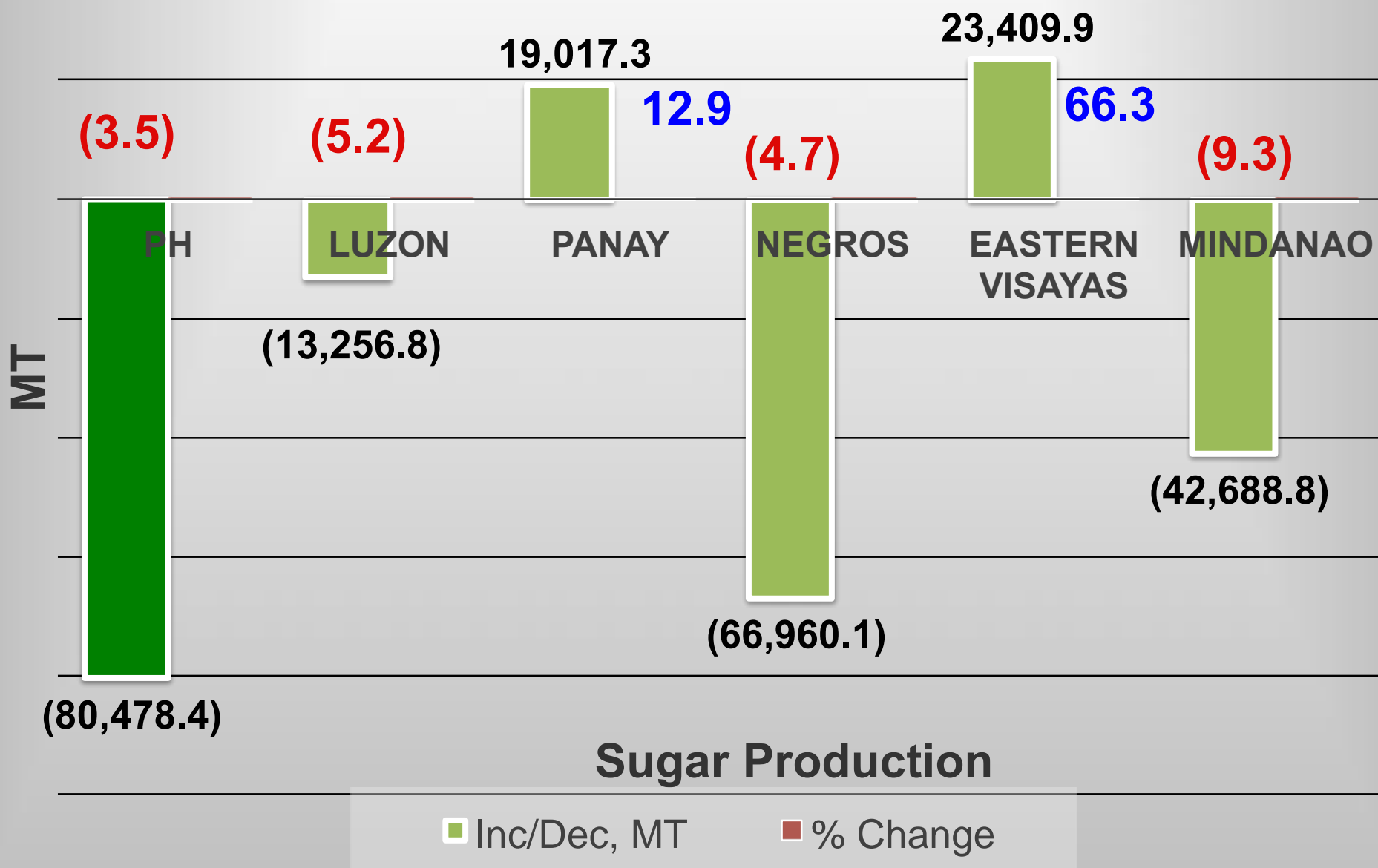
Sugar Production, CY 2015-2016 (as of July 31, 2016)



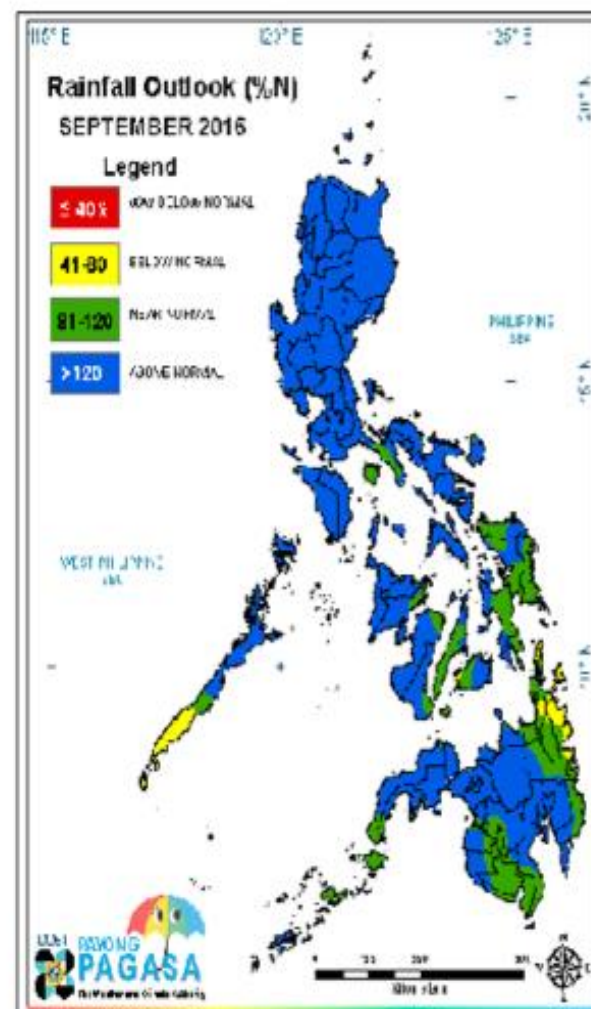
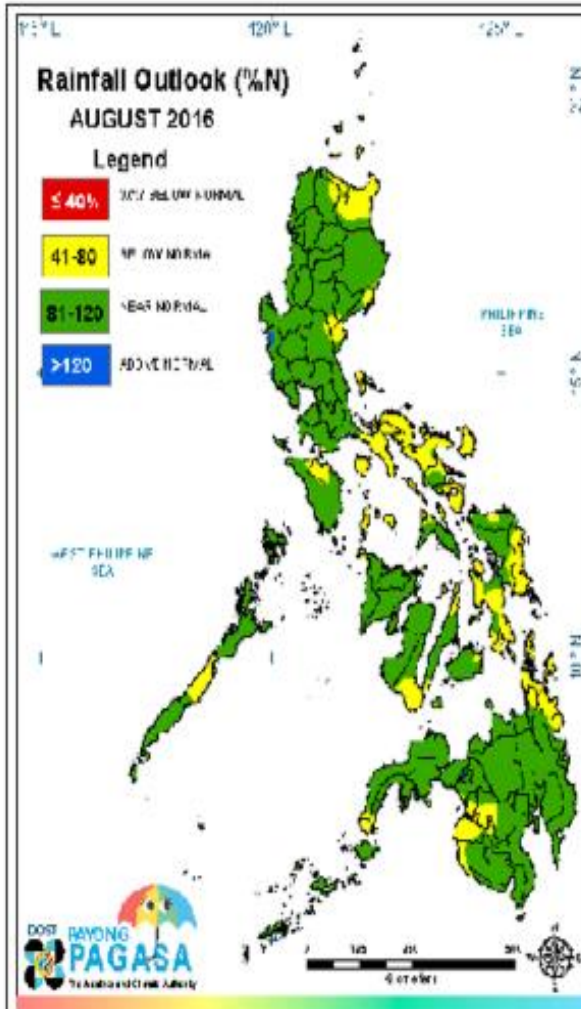
Top 10 Gainers and Losers (Mills), MT Sugar



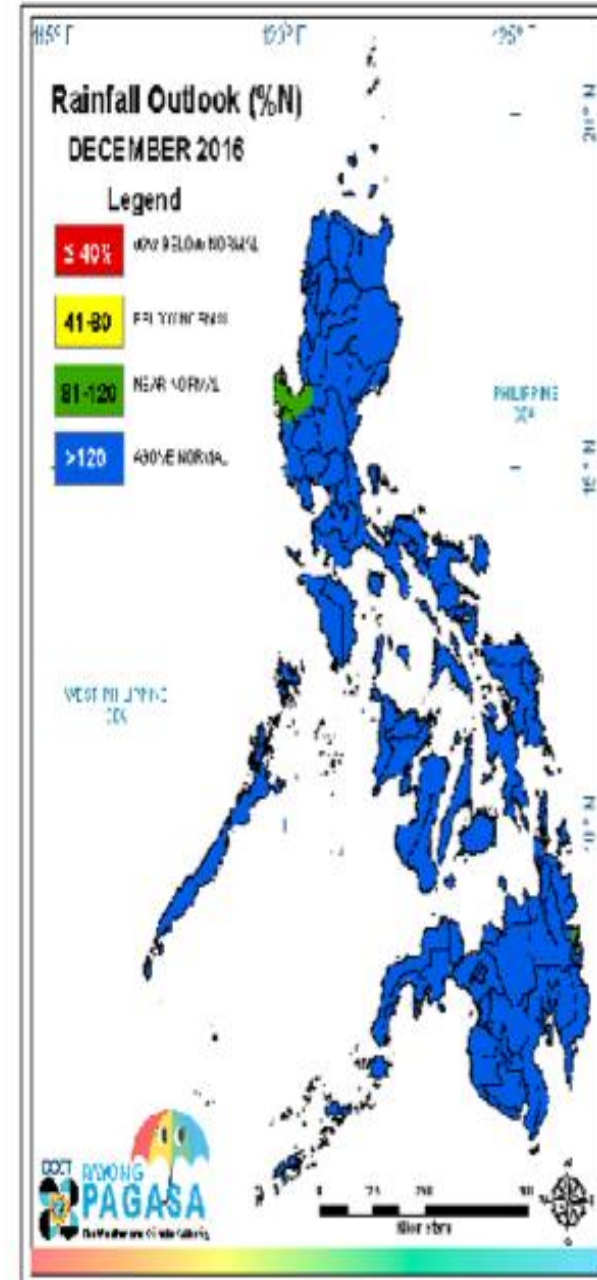
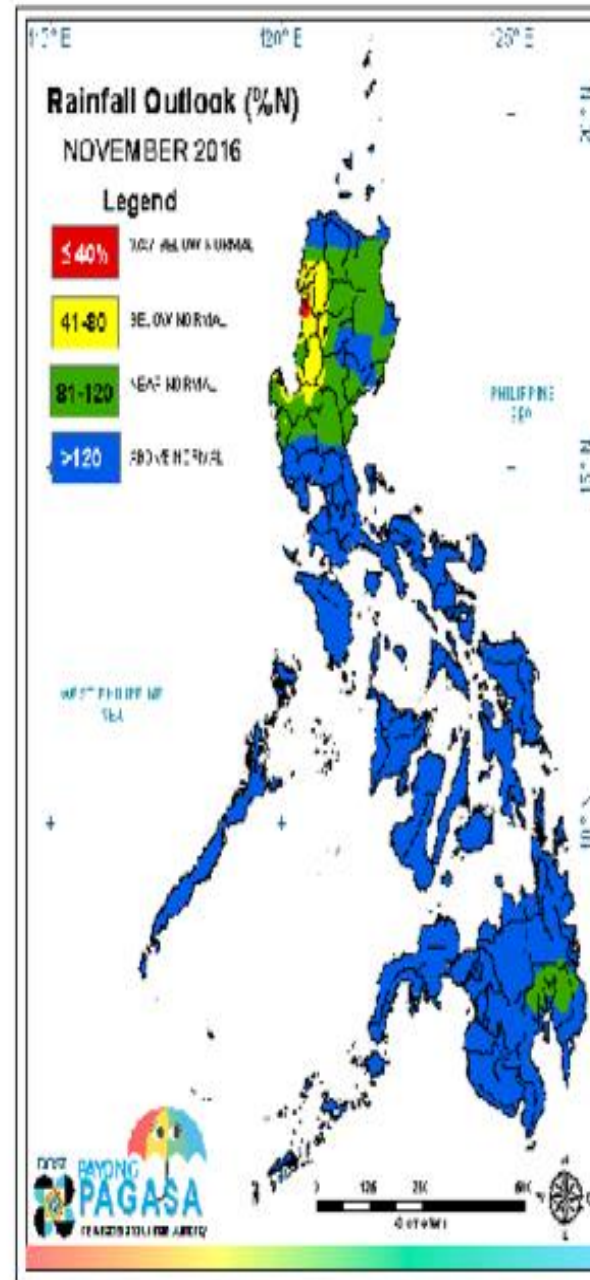
Growth Rate (%), By Region

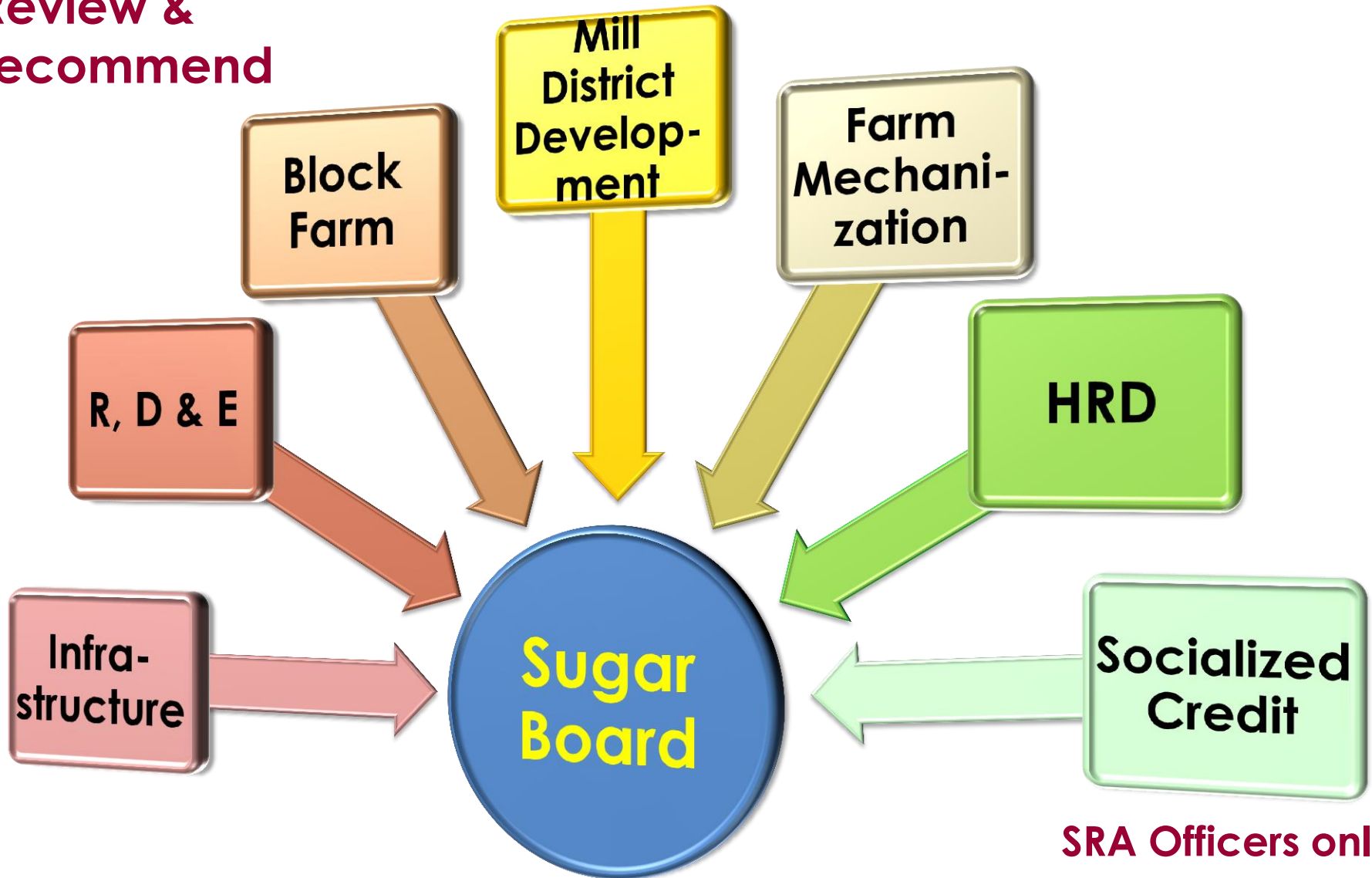

- Implementing guidelines???

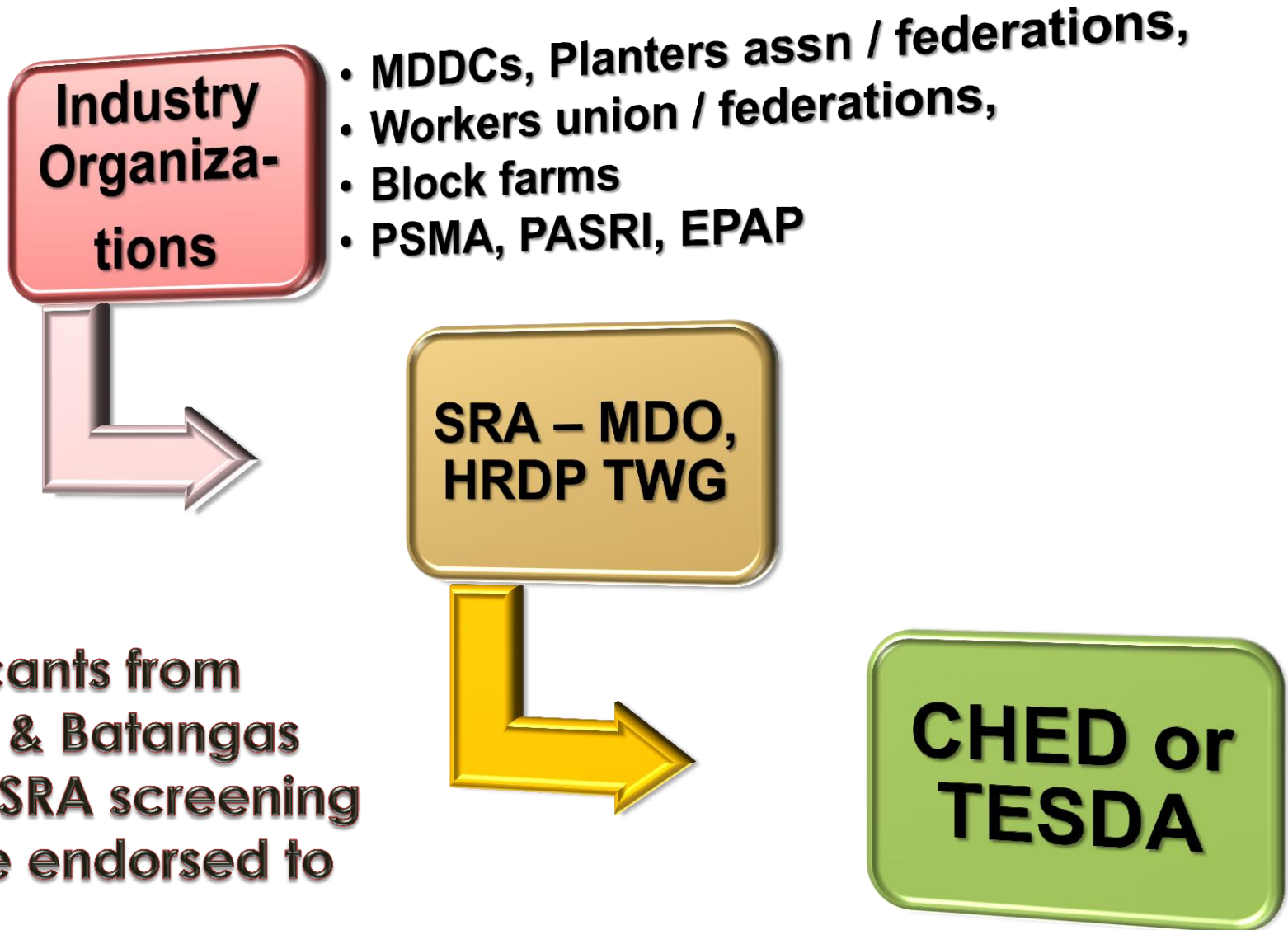
2016 SIDA FUND

SIDA Scholarship Program

CHED Coverage & Requirements

Open to qualified & deserving children & dependents of sugarcane farmers & workers

- *Dependent*
 - *a) the legitimate, legitimated, illegitimate and/or legally adopted children of sugarcane industry workers and small sugarcane farmers.*
 - *b) relative of the sugarcane industry workers and small sugarcane farmers up to third (3rd) degree of consanguinity or affinity who are living with them at least five (5) years prior to application*

Covers baccalaureate & graduate students enrolled in priority courses

- Farm-to-mill roads –P914.40M
- C/O DPWH
- Leading to block farms, endorsed by the MDDCs
- On-going inspection of FMR projects and bidding
- 2 road sections are under construction in La Castellana & Hinigaran
- Infrastructure Masterplan per mill district??? With year-on-year targets

2016 SIDA FUND

R, D & E

- Capacity bldg
- Acquisition of prototype farm machineries for testing in Luzon, Visayas & Mindanao mill districts
- Sugarcane research in partnership with PHILSURIN, MDDCs, SUCs, industry organizations & other gov't entities
- HYV nurseries, adaptability trials, NCT / NSIC
- Breeding station at UPLB
- Upgrading of SUC / MDDC soils laboratories
- Research agenda???
